Editorial

Friday October 7th will be our 4th Annual General meeting. For the past four years our small team of volunteers have worked with untiring dedication to help our community make their homes more energy efficient, save money on their energy bills and of course reduce carbon emissions. In a small way we are playing our part in reducing global greenhouse gasses and giving future generations a better chance of living in a world that does not have runaway global warming. BUT this can be such hard work. The other day outside the Co-op we came across people who:-

- Didn't care what the future held for their children
- Were too busy to bother about it
- Didn't mind about escalating fuel bills
- Stated they lived in an energy efficient home so could do no more

We feel this is just plain selfishness but are greatly encouraged by the many households who have asked for a home energy audit—**there're still absolutely free.**

We have helped many folk reduce their energy bills, make their homes warmer and more energy efficient and for some provided advice about the income that can be generated from photovoltaic panels through the feed in tariff scheme. The Government have recently introduced the Renewable Heat Obligation scheme and next year the Renewable Heat Incentive could give you an income for generating your own heat from solar hot water, heat pumps and biomass heating. **The message that is hard to get across is that no matter how energy efficient our homes are, it is the people who live in them who use the energy. An empty home doesn't use any energy or produce any carbon!!**

But back to our volunteers. We really could do with a few more to help spread the load. Every home energy survey can take up to a couple of hours to do and at times the team are rushed off their very willing feet. Climate Change, Global Warming and Energy Saving are not always headline grabbing stories yet helping now to reduce carbon emissions so our children and grandchildren will have a better life in 30—50 years time must surely be well worth a bit of effort. Battlefield Energy Challenge News

Earlier in the year with some grant support from Shropshire Council we challenged the three streets on the Battlefield Estate + Brook Meadow to see which could over the next two years make the greatest energy and carbon reduction savings. 37% on the homes have now had a free energy audit - there is still a way to go here, we would like to see it nearer 100% BUT great progress has already been made. More homes have increased their loft insulation and had cavity walls filled, new energy efficient condensing boilers fitted and by Christmas a number of homes will have had photovoltaic panels and or solar hot water installed. There are now more low energy light bulbs than before (we got some excellent quality ones for free thanks to the Shropshire Council Sustainability Team.) **However it's not just about having to spend money to save energy and reduce carbon emissions. Our trained home energy visitors have lots of advice on ways to reduce your energy bills without having to spend a penny.**

Ways to reduce your heating and electricity costs, even advice on how to reduce the cost of your travel.
