FRACKING IMPOSSIBLE!

Chris Cornelius, the founder and former boss of the fracking firm Cuadrilla, and a geologist by training, has stated that fracking in the UK will be impossible on any meaningful scale and will not help with the energy crisis. The geology of the UK makes it unsuitable for widespread fracking operations. The scale of drilling needed to make a significant contribution – and it would mean hundreds of wells – is not feasible in a small, crowded island. Nor would it reduce prices, which are determined by the wider market. Chris is now arguing for investment in renewables, such as tidal energy.

British homes are some of the worst insulated in Europe

Energy-saving measures, such as home insulation and heat pumps could add £7bn a year to the UK economy and lift many out of fuel poverty. (Cambridge Econometrics)
But last year insulation rates fell by 50%, and the Green Homes Grant was scrapped in 2021!

Government intervention is needed urgently - 20 million homes require extra insulation. Bringing the housing stock up to an acceptable standard and making life more comfortable for hard-pressed families is surely a no-brainer.

The options:

Produce or import more energy and let it escape

or

Insulate properly, reduce consumption and bills
