## Smart Export Guarantee\*\*\*

\*The Feed in Tariff scheme ceased on 31/03/2019 and has been replaced by the Smart Export Guarantee scheme. Those still in the FIT scheme will continue to receive payments until their contract expires.

\*\*Renewable Heat Incentive ceased on 31/03/22 but those in the scheme will continue to receive payments until their contract expires. It was replaced by the Boiler Upgrade Scheme (BUS) and this will expire in March 2028.

\*\*\*Smart Export Guarantee Scheme. (SEG) The SEG launched on 1 January 2020 is a government-backed initiative. The SEG requires some electricity suppliers, known as SEG Licensees, to pay small-scale generators, known as SEG Generators, for low-carbon electricity which they export back to the National Grid
